Financial report & GSS grants top-up

- The bank account has \$330.96, the expected GSS top-up is \$200 for a total of \$530.96

Graduate student input

- Far fewer graduate students than previous years (5-10)
- FGS calculates funding based on 2 years ago, meaning budget for graduate students will be larger than required

Budget Cuts

• \$100,000-\$300,000 cut for physics and astronomy

New graduate awards

New \$3000 awards for astronomy

"STRAC" policy

- Funding on sensitive topics (defense, Ai, quantum technology, medical and health technology, nanotechnology, etc) for topics we want to keep within canada:
 - You can't receive funding from those agencies if you are collaborating with at-risk institutions
 - Unclear on "funding" and "collaboration" and 'sensitive topics" definition
 - New students for international students that are still in communication with former supervisors from at-risk institutions then you may make your current supervisor ineligible for funding
 - This is a risk for large collaborations like ATLAS where coauthors may include authors from at-risk institutions
 - Most at-risk institutions are from russian, iran or china but this is list is not static and may change
 - End result: when applying for federal funding, you will need to attest that you are not working with individuals from at-risk institutions if your work is on sensitive topics
 - o This will be checked with 'random validation'
